Update on Burma Response: In response to the Cyclone Nargis crisis in Burma **Caritas Australia** supported the establishment of an international Caritas Emergency Response Support Team (ERST), of which Michael Peyra our Burma coordinator was a member. The team developed an emergency program of over \$US8 million to provide immediate medical, food and shelter relief to over 60,000 people. The team has been working through Caritas Burma, affected dioceses (Yangon and Patheingyi) and other church organizations in responding to the needs of people affected by the disaster. **Caritas Australia** has currently received over \$1.33 million for the Burma response from generous Australians. We have also successfully tendered for over \$500,000 of Australian Government funds to support the humanitarian work of the Church in Burma and the international Catholic health organization Malteser, which has a history of working in Burma.
